THE CLUES

4. Mabel, Millie and Martha did not have daughters named Carla or Carol, and Martha's son-in-law was not John because John was married to Caren, and their son was named Tom.
5. Millie was terrible with names, but she knew that her son-in-law was named either Joe or Jason, and her grandson was named either Tip or Tab.
6. Tab did not have a grandmother named Mavis.

THE STORY

THE CLUES

1. Perry, Pepe and Patricia were not taught by either the hawk or the owl.
2. Petunia took half as many lessons as Patricia but not the fewest number of lessons, and Paul took twice as many lessons as Perry.
3. Hooty and Honker were not loons, and they gave the most flying lessons.
4. Loony the owl gave twice as many lessons as Pecky.
5. Hooty the goose did not give the most lessons.
